Dear Readers,

The husband could only get a job that paid less than half what he earned at his other job. He cleaned tables, ran errands, did odd jobs, but still worked 55 hours a week. They needed help with their rent to keep them from becoming homeless. Do we look the other way because of the woman or do we walk in the direction of the Lord and help the child that is in need? I will always give a hand to those who work hard and mean well. Through our persuasion the mother got a job. I will not let evil stop me from helping.

We found an elderly widow. She was abandoned by the rest of her relatives, all much younger than herself. What do you think God thinks of that situation? I reached out and tried to talk to some of the relatives, but they were very cold. They are in a position to help, but they do not want to help. All of them had moved far away, breaking her heart. She cried in shame over being abandoned. Just because her family did not want to help her, it is up to us to show mercy and kindness. We

can go through life with blinders but then what kind of safe guard are we setting for ourselves when it is our time. Did we do everything we could to help a fellow soul? Did we help in every way we can? Did we help with the blessings that were bestowed upon us or were we selfish? Did we come up with excuses why we should not help? When our time comes, what will matter most is how we made our choices in life. How did we exercise our freewill? There are many diseases of the physical body, but how many of us recognize the disease that could steal our soul?

If we have been blessed with much, much is expected of us. When we have been given responsibilities, we need to follow through on them. There are many excuses, some as trivial as wanting to play video games 12 hours a day ignoring what is happening around us, or convincing ourselves that an elderly family member does not need or deserve our assistance, or abusing drugs and alcohol when our family needs us. We do not understand life when we do not want to listen with our heart. Excuses are many and life is full of decisions. For those that close their eyes and justify not helping, they have never really understood one of the strongest directives and that is to love our fellow creations. I have personally been living the pain and sorrow of the thousands that have been helped over the years. Together we have the opportunity to make a difference here and to present a program that will be an all encompassing help, to curb the violence against our women and children.

I do not have to explain in detail the brutality that is happening all around us. You can imagine the worse and then multiply that many times, that is what is happening. We can no longer close our eyes and ears to what is happening. And from the multitude of you who have written in, I have found out the brutality is more common than any of us can possibly imagine. Together, the brutality will be coming to a point of zero tolerance, bringing an end to complacent acceptance. There is going to be a group of people, which includes all of our authoritative bodies, to protect, prevent, to intercede with any acts of brutality, and to offer a place to heal both mind and body when these horrible acts occur. We need a place to help those that have been victimized. We need a place to provide healing. We also need a place to coordinate prevention to stop the violence. This needs to start from the smallest of children, to all ages of women. This is going to include the largest group of people in authoritative positions to help, those we have either voted into office, employ into their positions, and each and every one of us.

Together, our organization cannot be stopped. Only divided we will fall and fail as we have been. Yes, there is some assistance offered to victims now, but the number of victims is growing. So now I ask everyone to please open your ears, listen with your hearts, participate and support what we are about to embark upon. For those of you wishing to help in any little way, I applaud you. For those of you who have been blessed with much, this is your time, not to show us, but to show yourself, to show your creator why you have been blessed with so much. There is no other sin that is greater than the molestation of a child, the physical disfiguration of a child, the mental and physical abuse that damages a child's body. In each and every breath we take, it is up to us to make the world we live in a safe, nurturing environment for the children around us.

We need to show love, mercy and concern for one another. All of these are much greater than the abundance that one can accumulate. As some of you have read the article I wrote, "God Is Not the Only One Crying" that was one of the

many times I walked into a situation with that magnitude of abuse. God's answer to my questioning the brutality in this world; It is up to us to exercise our free will and make a difference.

We can think of it as a blessing if it hasn't happened to someone we know and love, but when you do know it is happening to any creation, the Lord does not want us to turn our back. We cannot be happy in our lives without doing God's will, without exercising our will of goodness. Together, all of us need to help. Please, do not ignore the facts, or the tears, pain and suffering of the young victims.

There is less than 2% that feel they need to implement pain and destruction upon our mental and physical being. This percentage may seem small but in numbers it is too great. How much sin in your life should be tolerated? How much injustice do you think the Lord says is acceptable? NONE. We have never in history come together strong enough, that is why the number of perpetrators of this crime has grown. I thank you for your patience for letting me come out in the open and talk to you about such a sensitive subject. While we have been trying to discard it and hide from it, keep it quiet, lock it in the closet, the violent brutality has been growing. The amount of pain our women and children have been withstanding at the hands of these monsters needs to stop. Please help; please let us create a life that we were created for. Let us listen, let us be proud, let us truly live our life to all that is expected of us, and together let us help make the biggest difference we can. Our Lord is watching our free will and how we exercise our choices for life ever eternal. Do we turn away, making excuses to be in eternal darkness or do we proudly walk out into the light and do God's will to protect the children? Please help, please make a difference.
