I am thanking God for his return to health and praying now that we do not become homeless.

We were blessed to be able to help this mother and son last week thanks to "You".

The mother began our long conversation that brought us back to the beginning of this woman's adult life. She had been a young woman with hopes and dreams that were sidetracked by a man who deceived her and physically abused her. When she was left as a young single mother with serious injuries caused by abuse, she had to change her hopes and dreams to those of an adult mother rather quickly. That included getting away from the abusive relationship to not only save herself but also her baby son.

Over the years she worked hard and with court ordered child support they got by each month. The mother made sure her son never endured homelessness or hunger. They lived frugally but the mother said they were happy and safe.

When her son became ill and had to be hospitalized for an extended period, the mother shared how she almost lost hope. She had felt overwhelmed by the thought of life without her boy, and he was the focus of all her energy.
